New pest Information

Pseudomonas (Bacterial Blight) blueberries: Water-soaked lesions are appearing on canes in some fields that then develop into a **reddish brown to black cankers**. Cankers may extend from a fraction of an inch to the entire length of 1-year-old wood. Buds in cankers die. If girdled, the cane portion above the canker dies. **Recommended treatments** are copper sprays starting when the temperatures get warmer, usually around **mid-February** in the Willamette Valley and SW Washington (Click on the photo of the week above for recent photos). **Good coverage** is essential with copper.
