Regional reports

These reports are from individuals within the region and are their particular observations. They are included to give an impression of the present 'state of the industry' and regional activities.

- **Whatcom County, Northern Washington:** (11/20) Pairing animals 2x2, holy cow it's been wet and windy. Only pruning raspberries and blueberries up here. Would like to get some lime on at some point. With SWD ([Spotted Wing Drosophila](#)) on our minds, it might be good to remove soft fruited plants like blackberry, thimbleberry, and salmonberry from around fields to take away potential SWD habitat .
- **Skagit County, Northern Washington:** (11/20) We're winterizing the last of our row covers; we had a few steel cables snap and 4 or 5 of the 14 x 6" posts lifted out of the ground by the strong winds. Pruning raspberries now and will start blues in January. Finishing up the last of a weed mat installation on some organic Bluejay. We may wait until ground freezes to finish. We will be cleaning all field perimeters of wild berries as a precaution to minimize potential SWD problems next season.

Cropwork

The winter rains are here in full force and most field work has come to a halt. However, if conditions allow, the following activities can happen.

With our newly emerging potential pest, the [spotted wing drosophila](#), it is likely that field sanitation will be an increasingly important economic element in eliminating possible breeding and overwintering sites for this pest.

All crops

- Can take soil tests for fertility and/or nematodes.
- Maintain weed control.
- Scout for voles and treat as needed.

Caneberries

- Can cut out old floricanes now and tie up primocanes.
- Scout and mark problem weed areas that could be treated in the winter.
- Apply lime, dolomite, gypsum and/or fall fertilizer.
- Subsoil and/or hill.
- Can apply copper or Bordeaux after tying up canes.

Blueberries

- Scout for weevil notching on lower leaves.
- Apply sulfur, lime, dolomite, gypsum and/or fall fertilizer.

Strawberries

- Scout weak areas for root weevil larvae, Strawberry Crown Moth, root disease or soil problems.
- Scout for weevil notching on leaves.
- Apply lime, dolomite, gypsum and/or fall fertilizer.
