Pest Management Information

Bacterial Blight (Pseudomonas syringae), blueberries.

Pseudomonas syringae symptoms in blueberries

- Late January and February can bring warm spells that can cause blueberry buds to start swelling.
- These swelling buds are vulnerable to infection by the ever present bacteria, *Pseudomonas syringae*, especially during warm, wet weather.
- Once infected, those buds are vulnerable to subsequent freeze damage at a higher temperature than buds that aren't infected.
- If warm, wet weather is predicted, applications of copper can help prevent Pseudomonas infections
- Caution: Many strains of this bacteria are resistant to copper compounds. Avoid over applying to help minimize resistance.

Starling management

- Right now starlings are starting to think about fledging (you know they are...). Population control
 becomes very difficult once that starts because they multiply rapidly. This is a major pest species
 that needs year round management attention.
